January 18—Annual reports are due to Karen Pohopin, Church Secretary. You may place reports in her mailbox in the back of the church.

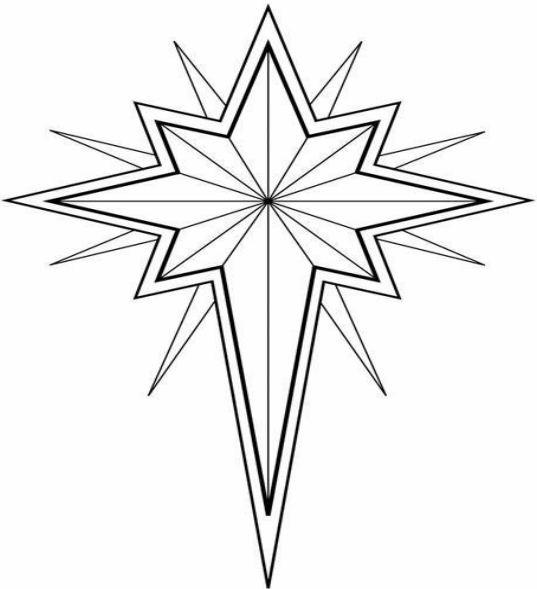
