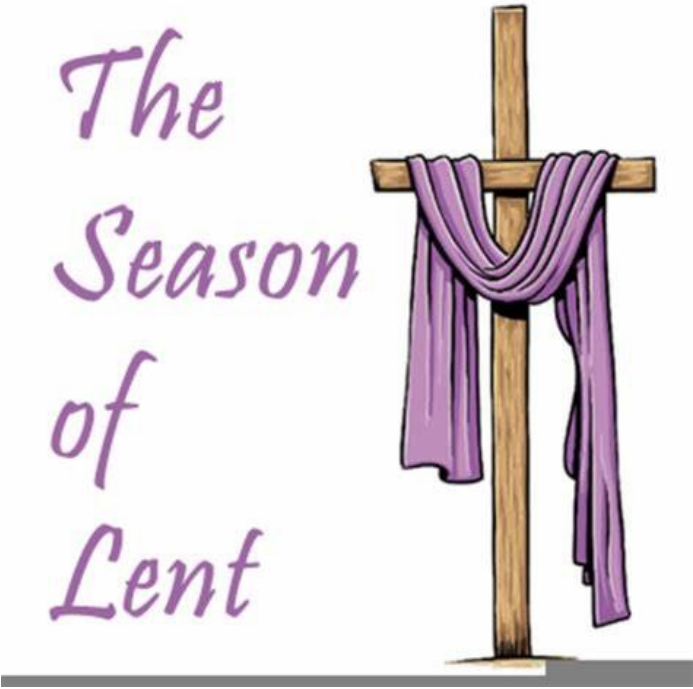
We still need 2 volunteers to attend the Synod Assembly in Altoona which will be held on June 17th this year. If interested, please see any council member.
