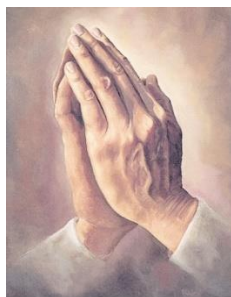

Lutheran Small Catechism 1979: The Sacrament of Holy Baptism

What is Baptism? Baptism is not water only, but it is water used together with God's Word and by his command.

What is this Word? In Matthew 28 our Lord Jesus Christ says: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."

What benefits does God give in Baptism? In Baptism God forgives sin, delivers from death and the devil, and gives everlasting salvation to all who believe what he has promised.

What is God's promise? In Mark 16 our Lord Jesus Christ says: "He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned."

How can water do such great things? It is not water that does these things, but God's Word with the water and our trust in this word. Water by itself is only water, but with the Word of God it is a life-giving water which by grace gives the new birth through the Holy Spirit. St. Paul writes in Titus 3: "He saved us...in virtue of his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal in the Holy Spirit, which he poured out upon us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that we might be justified by his grace and become heirs in hope of eternal life. The saying is sure."

What does Baptism mean for daily living? It means that our sinful self, with all its evil deeds and desires, should be drowned through daily repentance; and that day after day a new self should arise to live with God in righteousness and purity forever.

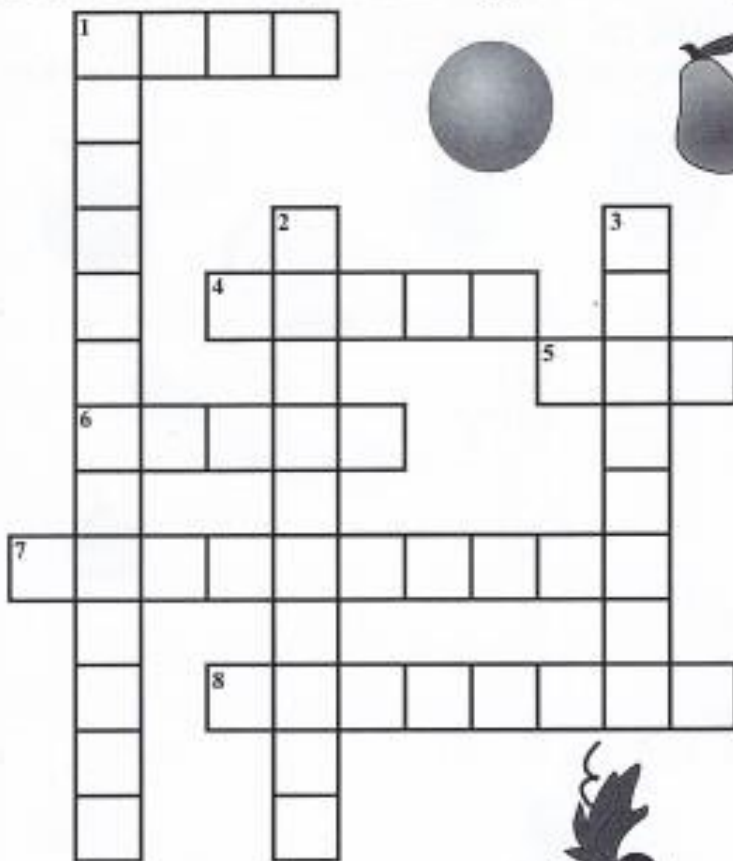

Devotions by Sarah Young 2004: Jesus Calling

Trust Me and do not be afraid. Many things feel out of control. Your routines are not running smoothly. You tend to feel more secure when your life is predictable. Let Me lead you to the rock that is higher than you and your circumstances. Take refuge in the shelter of My wings, where you are secure. When you are shaken out of your comfortable routines, grip My hand tightly and look for growth opportunities. Instead of bemoaning the loss of your comfort, accept the challenge of something new. I lead you on from Glory to Glory, making you fit for My Kingdom. Say yes to the ways I work in your life. Trust Me and do not be afraid. *Isaiah 12:2, Psalm 61:2-4 & 2 Corinthians 3:28*

Come to Me for all that you need. Come into My presence with thanksgiving, for thankfulness opens the door to My treasures. When you are thankful, you affirm the central truth that I am Good. I am Light, in whom there is no darkness at all. The assurance that I am entirely Good meets your basic need for security. Your life is not subject to the whims of a sin-stained deity. Setting the Table of the Lord

Last newsletter we looked at the different vessels used for communion. This issue we will see how to set them on the Lord's table and the linens that are used on the altar and their significance.

Preparation of the altar for communion should be done ahead of the service. First the chancel and its furnishings should be clean, and the correct seasonal paraments are in place, and that all linens are freshly laundered and ironed, and that all the sacramental vessels are polished, and that there are enough elements ready. This work always should be done with reverence and good order that befit Christ's presence. Acceptable ways of arranging the vessels on the altar and credence are determined by the available chancel furnishings, linens, and vessels; and by the historical practices and preferences of the Pastor.

1. A purificator folded in thirds lengthwise is placed over the mouth of the empty chalice, so that the right and left side hang down over the edges.
2. The paten is placed on top of the purificator. If desired by the presiding minister, a large host may be placed on the paten.
3. The paten is covered with the pall.
4. The silk chalice veil in the proper color of the day is placed over the pall and arranged so that a trapezoid is seen when viewed from the front. The corporal and additional purificators are placed in the burse, which is laid on top of the vested chalice. When the credence is not used the corporal is laid on the altar and the vessels are placed on the corporal prior to the service. If a flagon is used, the vessels are arranged in the following manner; the chalice, paten, and pall are placed near the front in the center of the corporal. The flagon is behind and to the right of the chalice, and the ciborium or host box is behind and to the left of the chalice. The purificators and lavabo are laid off to the side of the corporal. A credence is a small side table which is used in the celebration of the Eucharist. It is usually placed on the wall on the epistle (south) side of the sanctuary and may be covered with a fine linen cloth. When the vessels are placed on both the altar and the credence prior to the service, the corporal is laid on the altar and the credence linen is laid on the credence. Only the vested chalice and paten are placed on the altar, on top of the corporal, and the burse holds the purificators. The flagon and ciborium or host box sit side by side on the credence with the flagon on the right. In many congregations, the host box and the flagon are carried forward in the offertory procession. If this is done, they should be filled and placed on a table near the entrance to the nave. The vested chalice and paten are placed wither on the credence or on the altar. After the service altar guild members shall remove all the Eucharistic vessels and linens from the chancel and taken to the sacristy for cleaning.

We hope that this information clarifies how our communion table is set up and how important the vessels, linens, and the position of the vessels are. The altar guild members are a very important part of our church and their duties for preparing the Lord's table are very important. Please if anyone is interested in becoming an Altar Guild member see any council member and we will direct you to the correct person to sign up.
