April 2, 2026 - Maundy Thursday

Readings and Psalm:

Exodus 12:1-4 [5-10] 11-14

Psalm 116:1-2, 12-19

1 Corinthians 11:23-26

Gospel: John 13:1-17, 31b-35

Today, Lenten observance comes to an end, and Christians gather around the world to celebrate the Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection. We remember Christ's last meal with his disciples, but the central focus is his commandment that we live out the promise embodied in this meal. As Jesus washed his disciples' feet, so we are called to give and receive love in humble service to one another. Formed into a new body in Christ through this holy meal, we are transformed by the mercy we have received and carry it into the world. Departing worship in solemn silence, as the coming days are anticipated.

Prayer of the day: Holy God, source of all love, on the night of his betrayal, Jesus gave us a new commandment, to love one another as he loves us. Write this commandment in our hearts, and give us the will to serve others as he was the servant of all, your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, on God, now and forever.



April 3, 2026 - Good Friday

Readings and Psalm:

Isaiah 52:13—53:12

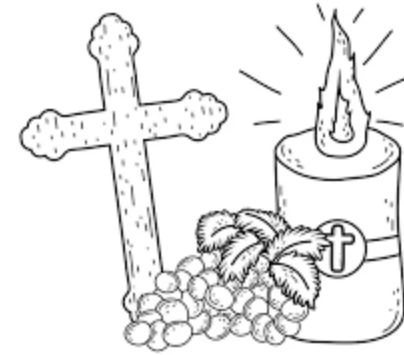
Psalm 22

Hebrews 10:16-25

Gospel: John 18:1—19:42

Life and death stand side by side as we enter into Good Friday. In John's passion account, Jesus reveals the power and glory of God, even as he is put on trial and sentenced to death. Standing with the disciples at the foot of the cross, we pray for the whole world in the ancient bidding prayer, as Christ's death offers life to all. We gather in solemn devotion, but always with the promise that the tree around which we assemble is indeed a tree of life. We depart silently, and we anticipate the culmination of the Three Days in the Easter Vigil.

Prayer of the day: Almighty God, look with loving mercy on your family, for whom our Lord Jesus Christ was willing to be betrayed, to be give over to the hands of sinners, and to suffer death on the cross: who now lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever.



April 4, 2026 - Resurrection of Our Lord Vigil of Easter

Readings and Psalm:

For the first reading, there are multiple readings:

Genesis 1:1—2:4a; Exodus 14:10-31; Isaiah 55:1-11;

Daniel 3:1-29

Romand 6:3-11

Gospel: John 20:1-18

This is the night of salvation! At the Vigil of Easter, we gather around fire, word, water, bread, and wine, proclaiming through story and song that ours is God who continuously brings life out of death. On this night we experience again, the heart of God's baptismal promise and the center of our faith; we are claimed and cleansed, renewed in the death and resurrection of Christ. We gather with all saints of every time and place to celebrate the good news: Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Prayer of the day: Eternal giver of life and light, this holy night shines with the radiance of the risen Christ. Renew your church with the Spirit given us in baptism, that we may worship you in sincerity and truth and may shine as a light in the world, through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.
